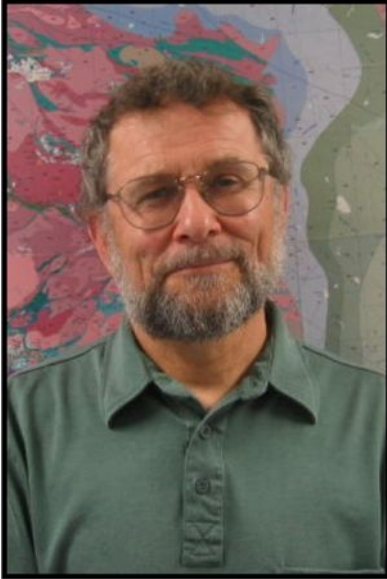

Greg Stott has been dedicated to public service and geoscience in Ontario for more than 25 years. He is an outstanding example of a professional Provincial Geologist. Greg's national and international recognition as a pre-eminent expert on Precambrian geology is based on 25 years of fieldwork across Ontario. Greg has consistently focused his efforts on activities that are in the public interest; providing excellent service to the users of geoscience data; and establishing productive collaborative linkages with academia, industry and other geological surveys.

Greg is an accomplished structural geologist, mapper and researcher of international repute who has advanced geoscience to the benefit of his profession and societal needs. He is a mentor to numerous geoscientists who have progressed to successful careers in geoscience. He is an educator who regularly transfers his knowledge of geoscience to students, other geologists and the public.

Greg's exceptional skills of observation and interpretation allow him to synthesize diverse geoscience data sets and develop geologic models that have improved the understanding of complex geotectonic settings in the Superior Province. His exceptional skill at "seeing-the-big-picture" provides him with the ability to generate ideas and models that are provincial and national in scope. He made invaluable contributions to the Geology of Ontario volume and the development of a Tectonic Assemblages Map of Ontario. Much of Greg's past work culminated in his landmark paper on the Superior Province in the 1997 "*Greenstone Belts*" monograph. More recently, he has been a significant contributor to numerous productive collaborations such as the Western Superior National Mapping (NATMAP) Initiative, the Western Superior Lithoprobe project and the TransHudson-Superior Margin Initiative.
